



### **Terminating a Local State of Disaster**

**Whereas**, on March 16, 2020, in response to the global COVID-19 pandemic, I, Ben Zeller, Judge of the County of Victoria, declared a Local State of Disaster for the County of Victoria; and

**Whereas** on March 23, 2020, the Victoria County Commissioner's Court passed a resolution continuing the State of Local Disaster until lifted by the Judge or Commissioner's Court; and


**Whereas** on March 31, 2020, Texas Governor Greg Abbott issued Executive Order EO-GA-14, which superseded local orders responding to the COVID-19 pandemic, and implemented statewide regulation of the COVID-19 response; and


**Whereas**, should the need for localized response reemerge, Chapter 418 of the Texas Government Code allows the Judge to declare a local state of disaster and to issue executive orders appropriate to respond to the COVID-19 pandemic;

**Now, therefore I, Ben Zeller, Judge of the County of Victoria, do hereby proclaim and order:**


1. That the local state of disaster declared on March 16, 2020 for the County of Victoria pursuant to §418.108(a) of the Texas Government Code is hereby terminated, effective at 11:59pm today, May 14, 2020.
2. That all executive orders I have issued under the local state of disaster are no longer in effect.
3. Pursuant to §418.108(c) of the Texas Government Code, this termination of a local state of disaster shall be given prompt and general publicity and shall be filed promptly with the Victoria County Clerk.

**Whereas**, on March 16, 2020, in response to the global COVID-19 pandemic, I, Rawley McCoy, Mayor of the City of Victoria declared a Local State of Disaster for the City of Victoria; and

**Whereas** on March 17, 2020, the City Council of the City of Victoria passed Resolution No. 2020-046, continuing the State of Local Disaster until lifted by the Mayor or City Council; and


**Whereas** on April 27, 2020, Texas Governor Greg Abbott issued Executive Order EO-GA-18, which superseded local orders responding to the COVID-19 pandemic, and implemented statewide regulation of the COVID-19 response; and

**Whereas**, should the need for localized response reemerge, Chapter 418 of the Texas Government Code allows the Mayor to declare a local state of disaster and to issue executive orders appropriate to respond to the COVID-19 pandemic;

**Now, therefore I, Rawley McCoy, Mayor of the City of Victoria, do hereby proclaim and order:**


1. That the local state of disaster declared on March 16, 2020 for the City of Victoria pursuant to §418.108(a) of the Texas Government Code is hereby terminated, effective 11:59 p.m. on Thursday, May 14, 2020.
2. That all executive orders I have issued under the local state of disaster shall expire, and have no further effect, upon the termination of the state of local disaster at 11:59 p.m. on Thursday, May 14, 2020.
3. Pursuant to §418.108(c) of the Texas Government Code, this termination of a local state of disaster shall be given prompt and general publicity and shall be filed promptly with the City of Victoria City Secretary.
